

Though the patient profile for NTM lung disease was previously focused on slender women, we are now seeing children and men with pulmonary NTM.

WHY do they get NTM?

Shockingly, recent scientific data demonstrate that therapies to treat illnesses like Rheumatoid Arthritis, cancer, Crohn's disease or psoriasis significantly increase the risk of NTM lung disease.

Some people have underlying lung diseases or problems such as cystic fibrosis, COPD, bronchiectasis and others, which make them susceptible to getting an NTM infection.
